AUSTRALIAN RULES CRENNIS



A Crennis Brigade (team) consists of either seventeen or eighteen players: four Square Pegs, two Bikers, one Third Eye, two Overlords, four Big Babies, two Toadstools, one Belcher,

one Charlady, and an optional Crooner. There is no referee or umpire in Crennis, and all disputes are resolved by arguing and fighting.

The Gonad is a small ball, usually about five inches in diameter, made from the untreated lining of a beaver's stomach, which has been ceremonially pumped full of fresh custard until it is firm and tight - this happens before each game and is the responsibility of the visiting team.

The double-ended Tallywacker serves as a dual-action catching-and-hitting device. This is the most important component of the player's kit-only one Tallywacker may be used for the entire duration of a Crennis Player's career, so they are guarded with a jealous fervor. Suitable for catching high-speed Gonads, and for removing smiles, teeth, wind, and kneecaps.
