Jaggy plays the villain and had to go up against Bon Jovi in the role of the Crow.



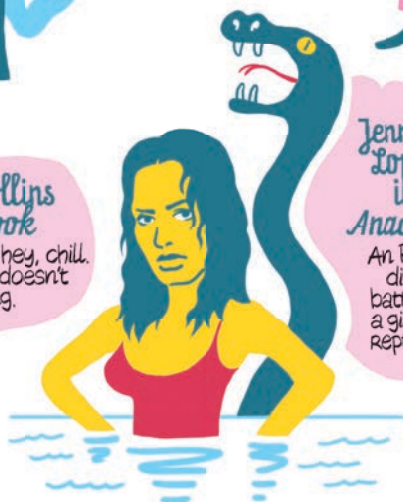
Phil Collins in Hook
