Edible stems

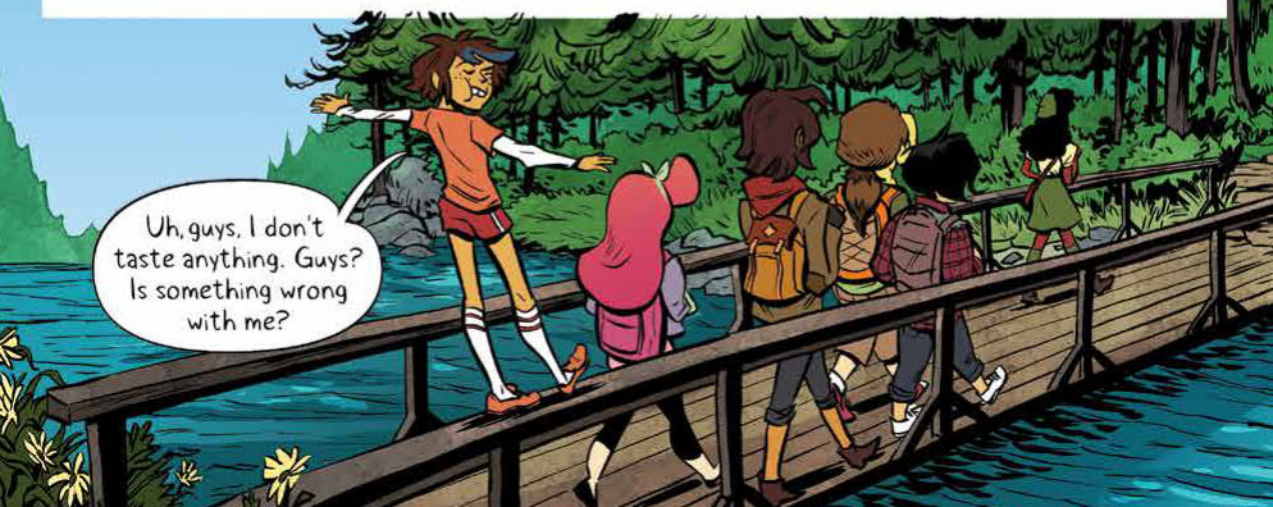

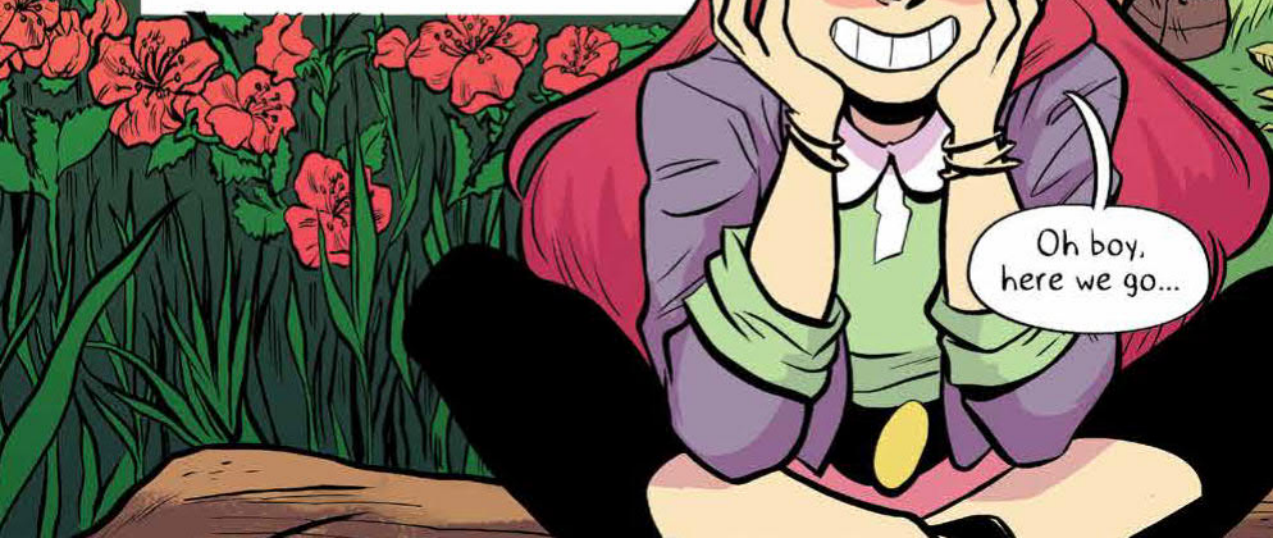
It's so pretty here!
